



**Class One Radio Broadcasting Service
Rules for Hearing**

VIBE 103.1**

In accordance with part 14 of the Second Schedule of the Telecommunications Act, 1986, (the Act), the Telecommunications Commissioners may determine its own procedures. Accordingly, the following rules have been adopted for a Hearing relating to an application for a licence to provide a Class One Radio Broadcasting Service.

1. The official notification of this Hearing (as required by section 11(2) of the Act) was published in the Government Gazette on Friday, April 30th, Wednesday, May 5th, Friday May 7th and Wednesday, May 12, 2010.
2. On a motion from the applicants or an interested party, or if the Commission considers it applicable, it may vary these rules. Motions to accept or vary these rules will be dealt with at the beginning of the Hearing.
3. The applicants will be allowed sufficient time to present their submission and supporting documentation, call witnesses, and respond (if they so desire) to any comments or other submissions received prior to or during the Hearing.
4. The Commission may present questions at any point in the Hearing. Unless allowed otherwise, questions posed by the Commission are expected to be answered at the time they are posed.
5. Those persons who submitted written submissions to the Commission prior to the Hearing will be invited to present their submissions and pose any questions they might have. Those persons who informed the Commission of their desire to make an oral presentation will follow. During the Hearing, any questions for the applicants, (other than those posed by the Commission) should be addressed by the applicants (unless otherwise provided for at the Hearing by the Commission) during their summation at the conclusion of the Hearing.
6. At the conclusion of all submissions, the applicants will be allowed sufficient time to summarize and respond to any comments.

7. The Commission may, at its discretion, adjourn the Hearing to a future time. The Commission may, if it feels necessary, reconvene a Hearing after its conclusion if in its opinion further matters need to be heard.
8. The Commission requires that all materials submitted to them include a total of 15 copies.
9. The Hearing will commence at the time specified in the Gazette Notice unless otherwise agreed by the Commission.
10. The venue for the Hearing will be that specified in the Gazette Notice unless otherwise agreed by the Commission.
11. The final report to the Minister will be confidential and she shall determine if the report, or any part of it, is made public.
